

## Mother's Day Forgiveness

**Ephesians 6:2** *"Honor your father and mother," which is the first commandment with promise:*

- I believe that one of the most important things you can do to honor your mother is to forgive her completely.

**Colossians 3:12-14** Therefore, as the elect of God, holy and beloved, put on tender mercies, kindness, humility, meekness, longsuffering; <sup>13</sup> bearing with one another, and forgiving one another, if anyone has a complaint against another; even as Christ forgave you, so you also must do. <sup>14</sup> But above all these things put on love, which is the bond of perfection.

- This passage is mainly focused on forgiving. It actually comes out of a section from Colossians focused on our character as a new person in Christ.
- It is easy to get focused on the list of things to do – be merciful, kind, meek, patient, bearing with each other. And then forgive others as Christ forgave you.
- But this list is only possible if we start where Paul started this list. Therefore, as the elect of God.
- In vs. 10 (**Colossians 3:10** and have put on the new *man* who is renewed in knowledge according to the image of Him who created him) he says we have put on the new man who is renewed.
  - What does that mean? We have been made righteous. We have been united with Christ. We are the image of God in His likeness.

But then he says to forgive. I believe that all of the aforementioned traits cannot be considered characteristics of a believer if they are not willing to forgive others.

But specifically, it says to forgive **as** Christ forgave you.

As = Kathos = in the same manner, or just as

How did Christ forgive us?

- **Romans 5:8** But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.
  - Jesus died for us to forgive us when we did not deserve it.
  - Forgiveness has nothing to do with whether they deserve it.

- **Mark 2:1-5** And again He entered Capernaum after some days, and it was heard that He was in the house. <sup>2</sup> Immediately many gathered together, so that there was no longer room to receive them, not even near the door. And He preached the word to them. <sup>3</sup> Then they came to Him, bringing a paralytic who was carried by four men. <sup>4</sup> And when they could not come near Him because of the crowd, they uncovered the roof where He was. So when they had broken through, they let down the bed on which the paralytic was lying. <sup>5</sup> When Jesus saw their faith, He said to the paralytic, “Son, your sins are forgiven you.”
  - What did this man do to earn his forgiveness?
  - People do not need to earn our forgiveness.
- Forgiveness is not based on right or wrong. Christ does not consider what people do when forgiving them. He forgave us completely by Grace without considering the right or wrong, or how deserving we were.
- God’s forgiveness is not conditional
- But His forgiveness came at a price. His own life. Grace is not free. It is free to us, but it cost God His Son’s life.
  - Our forgiveness of others may also cost us. And we cannot take into account whether or not they deserve it, if what they did was wrong, or how often they are wrong.
    - It may cost us our pride
    - It may cost us our anger
    - It may cost us humiliation
    - It may cost us being ok with someone having offense towards us
    - It may cost us being misunderstood
  - But - Forgiveness has nothing to do with right or wrong, it has to do with the life of Christ.

I believe that true forgiveness, forgiveness that does not weigh right and wrong, and that forgives even if it costs, and forgives even the undeserving without noting they are undeserving, is not possible without Christ.

That's why this passage of Colossians starts with ridding ourselves of the old man and putting on the new man:

**Colossians 3:1-15** If then **you were raised with Christ**, seek those things which are above, where Christ is, sitting at the right hand of God. 2 **Set your mind on things above, not on things on the earth.** 3 **For you died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God.** 4 When **Christ who is our life** appears, then you also will appear with Him in glory. 5 Therefore **put to death your members which are on the earth:** fornication, uncleanness, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry. 6 Because of these things the wrath of God is coming upon the sons of disobedience, 7 in which you yourselves once walked when you lived in them. 8 But now you yourselves are to put off all these: anger, wrath, malice, blasphemy, filthy language out of your mouth. 9 Do not lie to one another, since **you have put off the old man with his deeds,** 10 **and have put on the new man who is renewed in knowledge according to the image of Him who created him,** 11 where there is neither Greek nor Jew, circumcised nor uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave nor free, but **Christ is all and in all.** 12 Therefore, **as the elect of God, holy and beloved,** put on tender mercies, kindness, humility, meekness, longsuffering; 13 bearing with one another, and forgiving one another, if anyone has a complaint against another; **even as Christ forgave you, so you also must do.** 14 But above all these things **put on love, which is the bond of perfection.** 15 And **let the peace of God rule in your hearts,** to which also you were called in one body; and be thankful.

Everyone here either has or at one point had a mom. Everyone here has or at one point has had a father.

Honoring your parents does not stop when you leave home and forgiving your mom becomes actually even more critical as you are living your life not under your parents authority.

Mom's do the best they can with what they have. Same for dads.

No one is ready for it, and everyone feels inadequate.

We receive blessings, but also wounds. The ratio may depend on your situation.

And the good news is, God can heal any wound. If you are still speaking in to your children's lives, teach them to go to God for full healing.

Do not feel condemned. It is being in this world. God made provision for us in this.

## **Wounds**

- Judging – critical, never good enough. (**Proverbs 18:21** Death and life *are* in the power of the tongue, and those who love it will eat its fruit).
  - It's always your fault. Hurtful comments.
- Abandonment issues – not being there in whatever way. Children do not know how to interpret and may misinterpret pure intentions.
- Lack of protection – abuse, spiritual, mental or did not believe you about someone else, or just unaware.
- Not trusting or believing in you
- Taking sides.
- Unapproachable
- Rage or anger
- Not being a good character role model, or setting boundaries
- Did not teach how to relate to men or women properly
- Withholding love
- Self-centered.
- Abuse

It's not likely these wounds were intentional. But if there is any unforgiveness in us, we should still forgive. Go through the process of forgiving, even if you have said to yourself, "I know she didn't mean it."

If you find yourself blaming your mother for something that is a bad pattern in your life, forgive her for that. Healing begins when you take personal responsibility for your problems and do not seek to blame others for them.

I pray that God will help you to see that the hurt and pain I caused you came from my own childhood. It limited me, and I am so sorry if it has limited you.
